

## SETTING UP RESTRICTIONS

- Set up a passcode that needs to be entered before your child is able to access the content.



- Hide apps that your child may not need to access like YouTube, Facebook, and Safari.

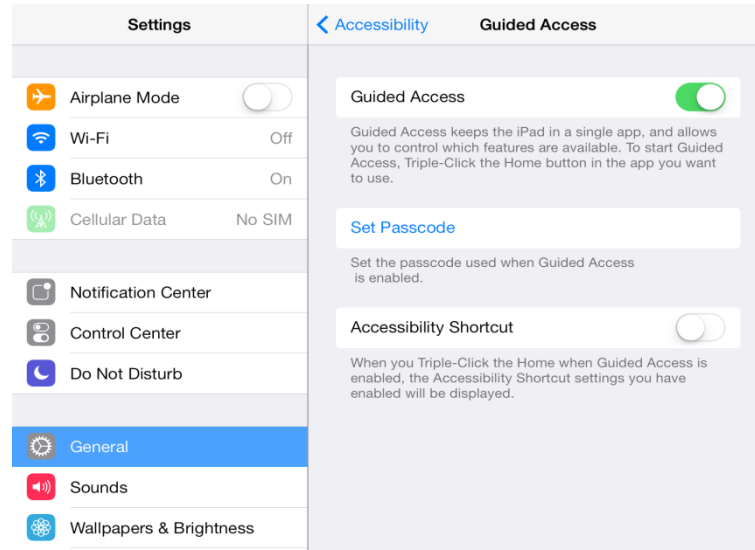


- Turn off in-app purchases. Many free apps prompt you to purchase the app. Turn it off so that your child is not able to access in-app purchases:  
Click on Setting > General > Allowed Content > In App Purchase > Off.
- Prevent access to the Home button. If your child often switches between apps by pressing the Home button, you could consider purchasing a BubCap that makes it difficult for them to push the home key.

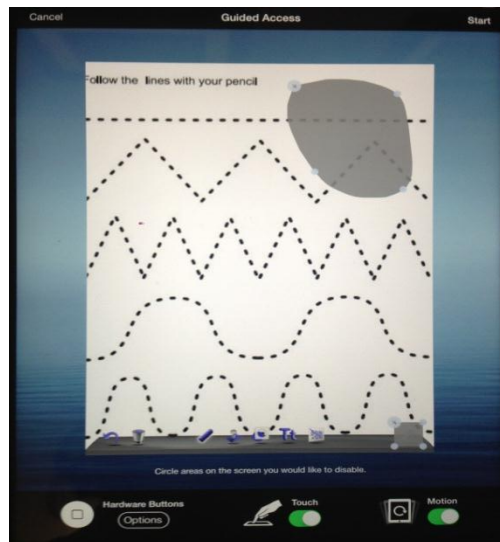


## SETTING UP GUIDED ACCESS

- This feature allows you to temporarily restrict the iPad to a particular app by disabling specific areas of the screen and preventing your child from exiting the app.
- To set up this feature, click on Setting > General > Accessibility > Guided Access.
- Make sure you turn Guided Access on and select a passcode.



- Return to the home page and select the app for your child to use. Once the app has opened, triple-click the Home button.
- This will then allow you to select buttons and areas of the screen to disable.
- Circle any part of the screen that you would like to prevent your child from using. Once you have chosen the area, click “start.”



- To end the Guided Access session, triple-click the Home button and select “end.”
